"Government strengthens aim of distributing LPG to a million households by 2020"

LPG can replace the use of electricity as a fuel for household cooking, which will help to conserve power as well as the environment. This will be beneficial to residents in rural areas, who do not have access to electricity, the minister said.

After distributing LPG to 150,000 households in 2017, the next step is to reach a million more by 2020. "The government and private sector will work together to expand the LPG industry in Myanmar so that it is able to supply the quantities needed," U Win Khaing said.

Myanmar does not have the infrastructure needed to produce its own LPG, thus providing opportunities for imports from the regional and international markets. The lack of infrastructure also give rise to investment opportunities for refineries upgrading and LPG logistics infrastructure.

Myanmar's LPG utilisation is currently the lowest among all the ASEAN countries, thus LPG awareness and usage promotion is in tandem with the supply chain development. At present, Myanmar imports around 5,000 tonnes to 7,000 tonnes of LPG, which is sufficient to meet just 5 percent of the total number of households in the country. Much of the imported LPG is now used for commercial purposes, such as in hotels, restaurants, tea shops and factories.

With the liberalization of Myanmar's LPG sector that allows private sector participation, the government aims to bring LPG to 150,000 out

of the 10 million households by 2018 and 2

million households by 2020.
