The recent collapse in global energy and commodities prices drastically impacted the economics of the phenol chain economics. Benzene prices has collapsed and propylene markets remain weak. Such uncertainty lead to volatile swings in the phenol/acetone supply resulting in excess capacity. With most economies going into recession, solvent demand for acetone is expected to slow and acetone supply will most likely outpace demand. Some experts have forecasted the next upturn in the next 18 months, what will players need to do to reposition their businesses. Will mergers & acquisitions become more prevalent as markets worsen?

Challenges abound in the polycarbonate and BPA sectors. Following increased concerns over the usage of polycarbonate in water bottles, demand has been impacted. 
